

Methodist Sports Medicine Center and Colts Celebrate Super Bowl Victory

The champions of Super Bowl XLI in Miami had a winning game plan, and the backing of Methodist Sports Medicine Center's winning team of orthopedic surgeons and physicians.

Since 1984, Methodist Sports Medicine Center has been on the Colts' sideline helping to prevent, treat, and rehabilitate injuries. The Colts 29-17 victory over the Chicago Bears marks the team's first Super Bowl title since the team landed in the "Circle City."
