## Methodist Sports Medicine adds physiatry services

Methodist Sports Medicine/The Orthopedic Specialists has expanded its orthopedic and rehabilitation services to include physiatry (also known as physical medicine and rehabilitation).

Gregory Strock, M.D., will lead this new branch of medicine for the practice, which emphasizes the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of nerve, muscle, and bone disorders that may produce temporary or permanent impairment. Strock will primarily

focus on occupational medicine, work-related injuries, back pain management, and fluoroscopically guided lumbar spinal injections and electrodiagnostic studies.

"I am delighted to be a part of such a well-balanced practice and am eager to work with such skilled physicians," Strock said in a press release. "This is the ultimate job for me; I will be able to provide non-operative care to patients sooner than often possible, so they can experi-

ence a quicker and more complete recovery, ultimately allowing them to do the things they were not otherwise able to do."

Prior to joining Methodist Sports Medicine/The Orthopedic Specialists, Strock worked as the medical director for the Spine and Musculoskeletal Center and Pain Clinic at the Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana, and as a staff physiatrist for Integra Spine and Musculoskeletal Specialist.

Originally from Anderson, Strock received an undergraduate degree from Ball State University and a doctor of medicine degree from Indiana University School of Medicine. In 2005, he completed his residency in physical medicine and reha-

ilitation at Indiana University, after which he secured several hospital and clinic appointments throughout the state, including one with Clarian Health Partners.

Strock is board certified by the American Board of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation and a diplomate of the American Board of Pain Medicine. He is an active member of the American Academy of Pain Medicine and American Academy of Physical

Medicine and Rehabilitation, and has published several research articles and chapters, and presented lectures on various pain management and physical medicine topics.

Prior to embarking on his medical career, Strock spent several years as a member of the U.S. Cycling team and as a professional cyclist.
